Witness to the Gospel

SAINT STEPHEN

A young Jewish man who converted to Christianity, Stephen preached about the Lord Jesus. In doing so he angered those who would not accept the truth of the Christian message. He was brought before the ruling council, the Sanhedrin, and testified regarding Christianity by reviewing Salvation History (see Acts 7). He concluded his testimony by saying, “Look, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!” (Acts 7:56). Stephen was then taken out of the city and stoned to death. Saint Stephen is the first Christian martyr. His feast day is celebrated on December 26.
